## **Building a more inclusive Ontario**

### LEARN ABOUT GENDER IDENTITY

- Under the Ontario Human Rights Code, people are protected from discrimination and harassment because of gender identity and gender expression in employment, housing, facilities and services, contracts, and membership in unions, trade or professional associations.
- People who are transgender, or gender nonconforming, come from all walks of life. Yet they are one of the most disadvantaged groups in society. Trans and non-binary people routinely experience discrimination, harassment and even violence because their gender identity or gender expression is different from their birth-assigned sex.
- Gender identity is each person's internal and deeply felt sense of being a man, woman, both, or neither or anywhere along the gender spectrum. A person's gender identity may be the same as or different from their birth-assigned sex. Gender identity is fundamentally different from a person's sexual orientation.
- The **OPS Bilingual Glossary on Gender Identity** offers gender-inclusive terms in French and English with definitions and synonyms.

## **Breaking the Binary**

#### **Gender identity**

• A person's internal and deeply felt sense of being a man, woman, both, or neither

#### **Sexual orientation**

 Physical, romantic, sexual or emotional attraction to a person

#### Sex assigned at birth

The sex of a person based on the primary sexual characteristics observed at birth

#### **Gender expression**

 The way a person publicly presents their gender identity
